## Golden oldies show their pace

**T**HE Historics wre out in force at Barbagallo Raceway at the weekend, providing a rare spectacle of what racing was like years ago.

The Clem Dwyer meeting, named in honour of one of WA's most prolific motor sportsmen, also featured some more modern machinery, including the Zamel's Plate, the big showdown in the hotly-contested Formula Vee category.

Jez Hammond, driving the sleek Ajay 06, won all the Vee heats to claim the Zamel's Plate. Second and third throughout were Bruce Welsh in the Jacer and Tim Riley in a Sabre.

Charlie Mitchell won the historics front-engined races in his beautifully-presented and fierce-

ly-driven TS Special, with Bryan Scrivenor (Dodge Brax Special) and Peter Eastwood (Northwood Ford) taking second and third spots.

Ray Stubber was king of the historic racers in his Royale RP31M with a trio of cars from the WA Racing Museum filling the next places: Lance Cardarine (Fieling F2), Neil McCrudden (Macon F2) and Derek Garner (McEntee F Junior).

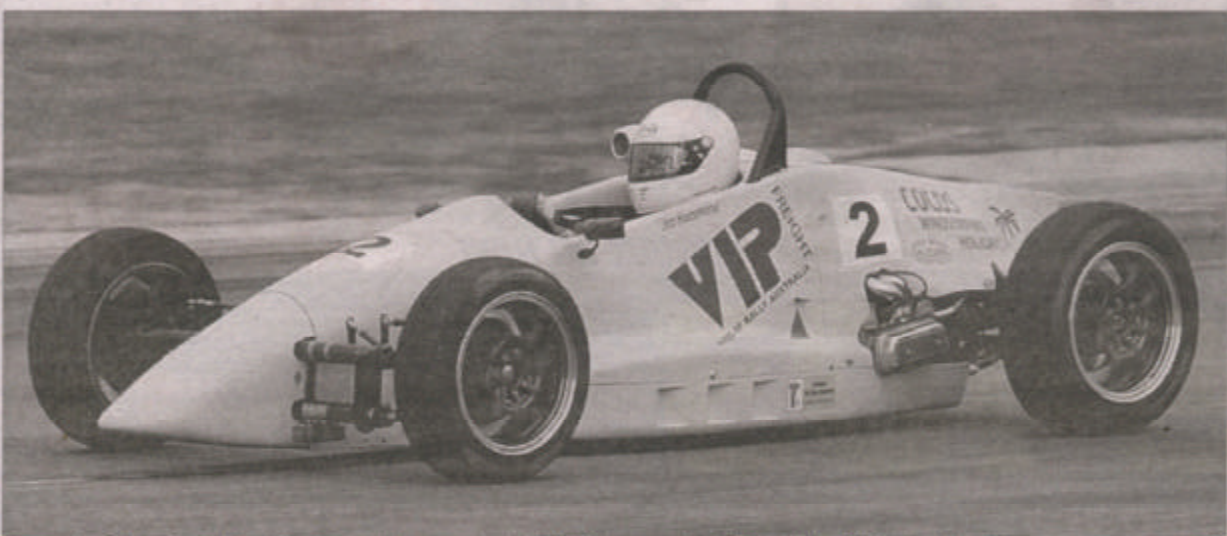
